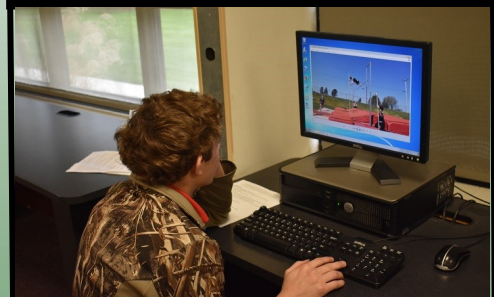
2017 Graduates
